## KIVIAT SHOWS SPEED!

## Schoolboy Runs a Fine Half Mile in Games of Clan-na-Gael.

Starting from scratch, Abel R. Kiviat, of the Curtis School, Staten Island, and a member of the Irish-American Athletic Club, finished second, two feet behind R. Buist, of the Pastime Athletic Club, to whom he conceded twenty-eight yards, in the half mile handicap run at the games of the Clanna-Gael, held at Celtic Park, Long Island, yester-The run was easily the feature contest on the day. programme. Kiviat, who is only seventeen years old, won the half mile junior championship at Travers Island a week ago. A big field of runners started in the race, and all had generous handicaps over the schoolboy. Kiviat's performance was better than two minutes, as the winner's time was

1:58 3-5, and he was less than a second back. More than five thousand persons attended the games, and the enthusiasm throughout the afternoon was of the kind that can only be put forth by the Clan-na-Gael. In the field contests John J. Flanagan and Martin Sheridan took part, and the lusty shouts that went up as each sent the weights through the air made it apparent that these two athletes are favorites of the Clan-na-Gael. Flanagan won the 16-pound hammer throw, sending the weight a distance of 172 feet 5 inches. His best effort was 185 feet, but the throw was declared foul. As was expected, Sheridan had matters much his own way in the throwing of the discus, and won by sending the missile 132 feet 3 inches.
